



SCIENTISTS have discovered our oldest known ancestor — but it has a face that, it is fair to say, you would not wish to see in your family album.

Believed to be the calliest prehistoric human a centor, it is a microscopic kag-like sea creature which lived about 140 olillion years again

Named Saccorhetus cerenarius, aftera cachke Catures created by its elliptical body and large mouth, it's new to science. It is thought to be the most primitive example yet found of a so-called deuterostome, a category including humans and other vertebrates.

This means the creature is likely to be the common ancestor of a huge range of species, including all animals with backbones.

The creature was just a millimetre in size, and lived in grains of sand on the seabed, according to new the journal *Nature*.







Should Christians agree with evolution?




Should Christians agree with a false ark?


Should Christians agree with modern versions about Hell?




What is the future without Christ?

Hell is a MAJOR doctrine.




Should Christians be like the world to 'win' them?


Can you love Jesus but not the Church?



WORSHIPPERS in Docklands will be able to have a pot in one hand and a Bible in the other.

The new harbourside suburb's first church service will be in a pub.

Anglican minister Guy Mason will hold his first service this month in the upstairs bar of the James Squire Brewhouse.

The 28-year-old clergyman said the pub was a natural meeting place for Docklands' many young residents.

"You could have a beer with your Bible-reading," he said. He expects opposition from traditionalists.

"It's helpful for the church to connect with the community in creative ways because God is still relevant," he said.

"It's a good venue, it's not dingy and there's plenty of room."

He's confident of a fairsized congregation for his first Sunday morning service on October 28.

The minister gathered a few of his 20-something flock yesterday with Bibles open - presumably at John 2:1-10 where Jesus turned water into wine.

The Docklands Church is part of the 165-year-old St James Old Cathedral in West Melbourne.


